

Facilities

The University provides facilities for its main religious communities of Christian, Jewish and Muslim students and staff. We are happy to discuss individual needs if you have any special requirements linked to your faith, belief or worldview. In addition, we can provide support and advice to help you to access faith and belief facilities across the University and local area. Many of Durham's colleges have their own chapels, as identified on the map: these include Grey, St Mary's, St John's, St Chad's, Hatfield, St Hild & St Bede, and University (Castle). In addition, multi-faith/quiet rooms are provided that can be accessed by students of all faiths, beliefs and worldviews at John Snow, Josephine Butler, St. Aidan's, South and Trevelyan Colleges. A Quiet Space is also located in the Teaching & Learning Centre (TLC126) and can be booked by small groups for appropriate use via **chaplaincy@durham.ac.uk**.
